MPP School-Based Tuition (SBT) Proposal

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UNC-CH Master of Public Policy (MPP)

- UNC-CH is second in Public Policy bachelor's degrees in the U.S.
- Will be the only MPP in UNC System and the only public MPP in North Carolina
- Our MPP will begin as an accelerated dual bachelor's-graduate degree.
 - Most MPPs require two years; our MPP aims for only one additional year.
 - SBT is only paid during Year 5
 - 25% of degree (4 courses; 12 credits) completed as/at undergraduate tuition.
 - 15% SBT for need-based financial aid & teaching assistantships.
- Knowledge, skills & experience to work in the public, private or non-profit sector.

MPP Return on Investment

MPP graduates see greater earnings and job growth:

- Median annual earnings for MPPs more than double the national average (\$106k vs \$52k)
- The occupations most likely obtained by MPP graduates are expected to grow 11% over the next decade, faster than average (6.5%).
- MPP graduates will enter the labor market a year sooner than their peers in two-year MPP programs, adding to their earnings and increasing their on-the-job experience faster.
