












Use of Economic Impact Payment by Race & Ethnicity in N.C., June 25-30



Figure 1: Percentage of Population Not Employed by Racial/Ethnic sub group in North Carolina, April -June 2020



Employment Income Loss By Race and Ethnicity



Employment Income Loss by Income Group



Housing Insecurity by Race and Ethnicity Averages (April 23 – July 7)






Reported Food Insufficiency by Race and Ethnicity

Average reported feelings of anxiousness by food sufficiency status










